## **Village of East Nassau**

### **Amendment to Village Vehicle and Traffic Local Law of 2003 The Village of East Nassau, Rensselaer County, New York**

Amendment of Local Law # 1 of 2003 excluding trucks and other such commercial vehicles in excess of a certain gross weight on certain designated Village roads within the municipal boundaries of the Village of East Nassau by adding additional Village roads .

#### **Section 1. Title:**

This law shall be known as the “2006 Amendment to Vehicle and Traffic Law of 2003 of the Village of East Nassau”.

#### **Section 2. Purpose and Authority:**

It is the purpose of this law to further the public health, safety and welfare of the residents of the Village of East Nassau, to protect residents and properties on the roads listed in the body of this Law and to prevent deterioration of such roads, streets or highways by heavy truck traffic. The condition of the roads and the safety on the roads set forth in section 3 of this Local Law has been undermined by truck traffic to such an extent that the Board of Trustees find that restricting

said roads to the provisions of Local Law #1 of 2003 is both necessary and prudent. This Law has been adopted pursuant to the authority granted to villages by section 1640 of the Vehicle and Traffic Law.

### **Section 3. Additional Roads**

The exclusion of the vehicles and combinations set forth in section 5 of Local Law #1 of 2003, entitled “Vehicle and Traffic Law of 2004 of the Village of East Nassau” is hereby amended by adding the following Village roads to section 5 of the aforesaid Local Law:

- A. Greenman Hill Road – along its entire length from County Route 21 (a.k.a. Dunham Hollow Road to the Village boundary line.

### **Section 4. Trucks Exclusion on Designated Roads**

The roads listed in Section 3 above shall be subject to all of the terms, provisions, restrictions and penalties set forth in Local Law #1 of 2004.

### **Section 5. Severability of Provisions:**

Should any section or provision of this local law be declared null, void, voidable, or invalid, such finding of invalidity shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this local law.

### **Section 6. Effective Date:**

This local law shall take effect upon filing with the Secretary of State of the State of New York.
